PRESENTATIONGOOD NEWS FROM OUR SCHOOLS

Summer Learning 2023

Summer School Principals T.J. O'Grady and Pam Dickerson attended the meeting to report on the various programs that took place during the 2023 Summer Learning Program. Summer learning opportunities included K-6 Summer School, Secondary e-Learning, Mental Health & Wellness Programs, Indigenous Studies & GLS Credit Program and Secondary Credit Recovery.

Secondary summer learning included 4-week long e-learning courses, offering three RCCDSB Grade 10 Civics and Careers courses & two Grade 11 World Religion courses, with 162 students enrolled – 85 BSCHS students and 77 SJHS students. There were also 20 Co-op students – 11 from BSCHS and 9 from SJHS. The Co-op students either went to their established place of work or the teacher found them a placement. Teachers dropped in on them every few days and they had assignments to complete as well.

Courses were also offered through other boards across Ontario, including Grade 12 Business, Grade 12 Canadian & World Issues, Grade 12 College Math, Grade 12 Data Management, Grade 10 Math, Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course, Grade 11 Chemistry and Grade 10 Science. Twenty-five RCCDSB students were enrolled in these e-learning courses.

In an effort to aid students in reaching their full potential, an August Credit Recovery Program was also offered for the first time to provide an opportunity for all students to be successful in summer e-learning.

It was noted that there had to be substantial learning gaps for students to attend this year's elementary summer learning program. The program was held over 3 weeks in July from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. The primary/junior classes were held at three in-person sites: St. James, Eganville; Our Lady of Lourdes, Pembroke and St. Joseph's High School in Renfrew. The program goals and outcomes were to narrow and close learning gaps, create student profiles to provide targeted instruction in the areas of literacy and numeracy, provide mental health and wellness opportunities and to provide an engaging and fun program. The RCCDSB Curriculum and Special Education teams were also involved, using current evidence-based research and programming and resources, which included a virtual professional development session prior to the start of summer learning. The PASS assessment was used to collect pre and post data for all students to support small group instruction and teaching for teachers.

In addition to reporting progress to parents, all correspondence was also sent to students' home schools so their current teachers could gauge their success and to assist with planning for the new school year. A summer learning report was sent to all families at the end of the program which provided a summary of their child's learning, strengths and next steps. A survey was also sent to parents requesting feedback on the program and overall results indicate the program exceeded parent expectations. There was also some feedback from parents that indicated that they felt the effects of COVID regarding learning gaps were still being felt.

As a result of feedback and to help determine next steps, the team has concluded that the summer learning program should maintain precise programming. Elementary feedback has indicated that transportation would make the program more accessible and that it would be beneficial to open programming up to a larger population of students with additional sites and staffing. For secondary, it was determined that there should be a pre-summer session by guidance departments regarding eLearning to set out what the expectations and requirements are. Weekly staff meetings for teachers to attend to check in with summer school principals would also be helpful. Mental Health and Wellness programming was offered in partnership with the elementary summer learning program. Rebecca Paulsen and Kevin DeRuiter offered weekly programming and presentations based on faith, hope and love and community building through theme days such as Ninja and Pirate Day. In addition to these theme days, all summer school students were bused to a community event held on July 21st at St. James School in Eganville for a morning of mental wellness activities and fun. Community members were also invited and it was very well attended.

Bob Schreader expressed the trustees' appreciation to T.J. and Pam and the summer learning team for all the work they put in to ensure that the summer learning program was a huge success again this year. He thanked them all for their time this summer.

Good News Release – Indigenous Summer Programs

The Board's Indigenous Summer Learning program continued this summer, with some Grade 8 Indigenous students working towards achieving a general learning reachahead credit focused on project management. In June, students began to rejuvenate and redesign a courtyard space at Bishop Smith Catholic High School. They learned about the steps of project management and underwent safety training. Throughout the process, they were able to research designs, consult with a biologist and learn about budgeting.

During the week of July 10-14, students working towards a credit and those completing community hours to fulfill their graduation requirements, worked to implement the vision. The Board was fortunate to partner with Skills Ontario, who gifted each student with a tool bag and tools. Skills Ontario also joined in the project for a day giving the students a presentation on the skilled trades and crafted both birdhouses and birdfeeders with the students. Although the project is ongoing and the credit work continues, students were able to gain on-the-job experience and skills related to project management and general landscaping. An opening ceremony is planned for later in the fall.

The 2023 North American Indigenous Games (NAIG) took place in Halifax, Nova Scotia in July. This event takes place every 3-4 years and the best Indigenous athletes get the opportunity to compete against teams across North America. RCCDSB had 5 students participate in the games – Nolan and Lena Costello and Mark and John Bailie, along with one coach, Gerry Benoit, the Board's Indigenous Graduation Coach.

Lena Costello played for U16 girls' basketball for Team Ontario, making it to the quarterfinals. Her brother, Nolan Costello, played U19 boys' basketball for Team Ontario, losing in a triple overtime game for the bronze medal against Minnesota. Mark Bailie came 10th in the 800m race and 8th in the 1200m race. His brother John Bailie, participated in the shot put and javelin and came in 4th place in those events. The brothers, who attend St. Joseph's High School in Renfrew, ran together in the 4x100m and while they initially came in 3rd, New Mexico was disqualified, awarding the Bailie brothers the silver medal.

Gerry Benoit coached U14 boys' basketball with Indigenous athletes between 12-14 years old across Canada. This was the first time in several years that these games were able to take place and Gerry recalled some exciting moments during the semi-final games against Team BC. He said the most important takeaway is working towards a common goal with someone you may not know. Some of the athletes only met one another on this trip but everyone came together to display the true definition of teamwork.

The City of Pembroke has invited all the athletes and Coach Benoit to the Pembroke City Council meeting on Tuesday, September 5th.
