Witness & Integrity

22 (all) RCCDSB schools rose to the distance learning challenge, finding innovative ways to participate in Catholic Education Week. From livestreaming morning prayers, and creating video messages of hope and encouragement for others, students and staff were *Igniting Hope* virtually.

125 meal kits and online instructions delivered to students in Grades 10, 11 and 12 Hospitality and Tourism classes at Bishop Smith Catholic High School and to families in need across the county. The hands-on, reach-ahead learning experience was carried out in partnership with East Side Mario's.

Achievement & Potential

5 new software licenses purchased to align with our high yield instruction in literacy and numeracy and to support the transition between in-class and blended or virtual learning (SeeSaw, RAZ Kids Plus, Generation Genius, Currents4Kids, MathUp Classroom).

21 students challenged the DELF, with a 100% success rate! This is a testament to the high quality of both Core and Extended French Language Teaching and Learning in the board. Not only does the DELF allow us to provide students with an internationally-recognized, but it also serves as a celebration of student commitment to learning a second language, and encourages the growth of the French program, both at the Core and Extended French levels.

100 packages of basic school supplies delivered to students who needed them during emergency distance learning.

~ 200 students were contacted by our Indigenous Education Lead during the emergency distance learning between March and June to ensure that they could engage in learning.

Dignity & Belonging

1 community drum purchased to offer a cultural opportunity to our First Nations and Métis students. We offered drumming lessons with a community member.

18 (all) RCCCDSB elementary schools received a Treaty presentation from our Indigenous Education Lead to promote education and awareness about treaties and treaty relationships.

40 WiFi hotspots distributed to families to ensure internet access for distance learning.

1,720 devices lent to students who did not have access to technology during the closure. This represents 35% of the 2019–2020 RCCDSSB student population.
